Albany Environmental Law Firm to Discuss Hydraulic Fracturing (“Fracking”) for Natural Gas

Young Sommer LLC, an Albany law firm specializing in environmental law, land use planning and development, will present a “Primer on the Law, Technology and Economics” of “Fracking” at the May 9, 2012 Breakfast meeting of the Malta Business and Professional Association (MBPA). The meeting will be held at the Ballston Spa National Bank, Corporate Branch Office, 990 Route 67, Ballston Spa, NY, beginning at 7:30 am.

The proposal to extract natural gas from the Marcellus Shale formation in southern and western New York has sparked an extended regulatory review by the NY Department of Environmental Conservation and a heated public debate. Some believe that harvesting what appears to be a plentiful and lower cost resource will create jobs, ease energy costs for homeowners and businesses and spur economic recovery. Others contend that the “fracking” process will pollute drinking water supplies if not limited or regulated.

Michael Moore and Elizabeth Morss of Young Sommer will present an overview of the many and complicated issues in this ongoing public policy debate. As always seems to be the case when the subject is “Fracking” a lively response can be expected. ABU DHABI TRIP with SARATOGA COUNTY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

September 18th-September 26, 2012

One of the priorities of the Saratoga County Chamber of Commerce is to be an innovative provider of focused programming to help our community maximize its potential as a global destination for talent, tourists and trade.

Last year the Chamber organized a 9 day trip for 55 people to China. This year's trip, departing on September 18th and returning September 26th, will be to the United Arab Emirates with stops in Abu Dhabi and Dubai. Saratoga County has numerous important and interesting connections to this part of the world. Sheik Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum (Sheik Mohammed), ruler of Dubai, is the owner of two horse farms in Saratoga Springs. His close associate, Abdulla Al Habbai, is the owner of the famous Fasig-Tipton Horse Auction House in Saratoga Springs.

Non horse-related connections include GLOBALFOUNDRIES. GLOBALFOUNDRIES is wholly owned by parent company ATIC, which is wholly owned by the Abu Dhabi government and is headquartered in Abu Dhabi. Working with local and abroad members of GLOBALFOUNDRIES and ATIC, some special events for the travelers are being organized. Travelers will have a reception after arriving in Abu Dhabi at the wafer shaped headquarters of ATIC with ATIC business leaders, and area dignitaries. While in Dubai, we will receive behind the scenes access to tour Meydan Racecourse, home of the Dubai World Cup, the world's premier horse race. These special events are in addition to the established itinerary of the trip.


